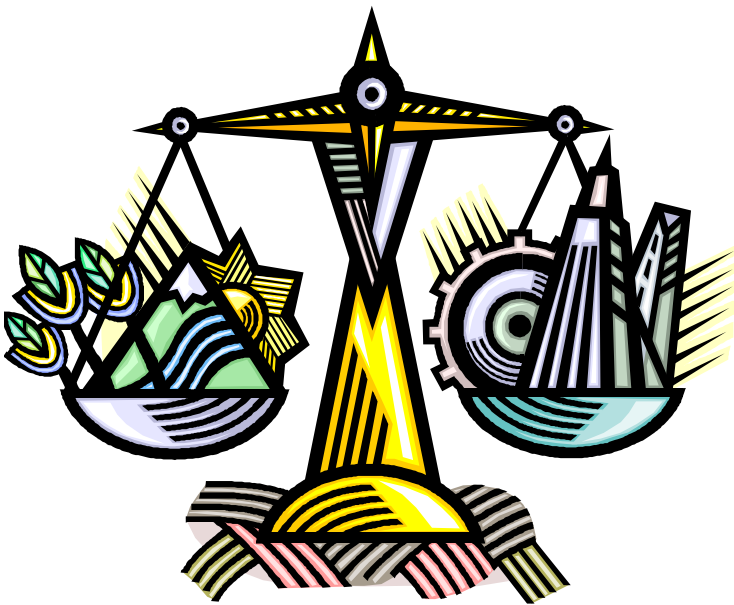

Reforming Federal Endangered Species Funding An Experiment Taking the Policy Turn



This presentation illustrates interests in research at the interface of multi-disciplinary approaches to understanding and managing environments - e.g., philosophical, scientific, policy, economic, and educational. Dr. Bauer will discuss her ongoing, collaborative project to reform federal policy for allocating funds to threatened and endangered species.

This project demonstrates a role for environmental philosophers to work with scientists, policy analysts, economists, community interest groups, and others toward reflective, effective environmental policy and practice.

Marybeth Bauer received a Masters in Natural Resources from Ohio State University in 2000, and her PhD in Philosophy from Bowling Green State University in 2004. Professor Bauer is currently a lecturer in the Environmental Studies Program at the University of Maryland.
