Consumption -- the physical throughput of materials in human lives -- is a serious ethical issue, due to the effects it has on consumers, human others, and the non-human natural world. In this presentation, Hartman defines four themes rooted in the Christian tradition that may guide ethical decision-making around consumption.



The insights presented will equip Christians and others to think critically about consumption and to find reasons for both restraint and celebration.
