“Thoughts About the Future of U.S. Science”

The United States has enjoyed over six decades of extraordinary scientific discovery and technological innovation. But there are storm clouds on the horizon – threats to the future of U.S. science – that will require a change in direction for U.S. science policy. In this talk, Dr. Lane traces the history of U.S. science and technology, describes some policy issues (e.g., federal research funding, public understanding, the influence of politics and ideology) that need attention, and offers thoughts about the future of U.S. science.

Baker III Institute for Public Policy and in the Department of Physics and Astronomy. Prior to returning to Rice University in January 2001, Dr. Lane served in the Clinton Administration as Assistant to the President for Science and Technology and Director of the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, and before that as Director of the National Science Foundation.
