Towards a Holistically Sustainable Development

Dr. Lozano aims to defend a development that goes beyond the purely techno-economic questions. A development that considers our position in the natural world; that, for example, considers our transit from a purely biological evolution to an ethical evolution. A development that encompasses three types of peace: an ecological one with the nature, a social one through justice, and an interior at the Individual level. These three levels of peace complement each other in the search of obtaining an integral and sustainable human development in this small blue planet.



Dr. Francisco Lozano is a biologist, with a complementary Master in Humanities. He is currently completing a Ph.D. in philosophy, researching on Hans Jonas. He is a professor of environmental sciences and environmental ethics at the University Ramon Llull (Barcelona, Spain). He is a founding member and coordinator of the Center for Studies about the Biosphere at the Institute of Holistic Culture.
