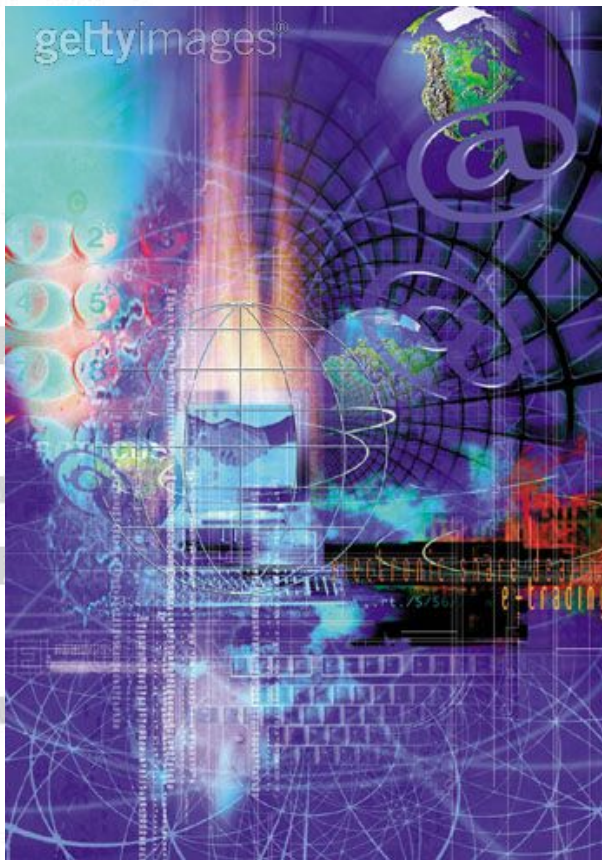

DIGITAL DEVELOPMENT and the

TECHNOLOGICAL CONFIGURATION OF CULTURE



In connection with technological innovation, citizens, policymakers, engineers, and activists across the globe have come to face numerous moral, political, and conceptual problems. In this talk, Dr. Selinger examines how philosophers have addressed globalization, and explains why these contributions, diverse as they are, have all been limited.

By turning to the issue of digital technology transfer, Dr. Selinger will conclude by proposing preliminary strategies for how philosophers of technology can interrogate and get beyond the limited conceptual horizon that posits the digital divide as a primary global problem and distributive justice as its basic solution.

Evan Selinger is an Assistant Professor of Philosophy at Rochester Institute of Technology. He has published several books and articles about philosophical issues concerning technology. His current project, *Embodying Technoscience*, investigates what debates about artificial intelligence, cognition enhancement, and simulation teach us about human identity.
