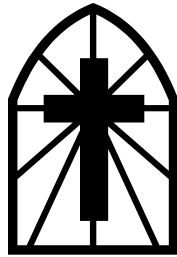
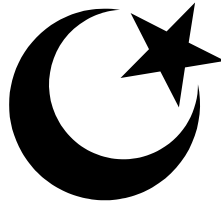

The Wall Between *Church–Mosque–Temple and State* **A Growing International Issue**

Dr. Flowers was a John F. Weatherly Professor of Religion at TCU from 1998 to 2003. He has served on the Board of Trustees of Americans United for Separation of Church and State from 1984 to present and has been the President of the North Texas Chapter of Americans United for Separation of Church and State from 1997 to present, as well as being a member of the Supreme Court Historical Society. He was the winner of the Liberty Bell Award in 1994 "to recognize an outstanding lay person in our area who has made the most selfless contribution to his or her community and thereby strengthened the effectiveness of the American system of justice," in addition to being the winner of the Chancellor's Award for Distinguished Teaching, Texas Christian University, 1998. His most recent publications include *Toward Benevolent Neutrality: Church, State, and the Supreme Court*, co-authored with Professor of Political Science Robert T. Miller (Baylor University Press), *That Godless Court?: Supreme Court Decisions on Church-State Relationships* (Westminster John Knox Press, 1994), and "On Losing One's Soul: Churches Risk Gaining the World, But Squandering Their Spiritual Wealth," *Church and State* 36 (March 1983).
